Spirituality for Busy People Seminar
The Dark Night of Mother Teresa (1910-1997)

Presentation by Fr. Kevin Joyce

Sunday, May 2, 4:00-5:45 PM

A book titled *Come Be My Light: the Private Writings of the "Saint of Calcutta,"* (Doubleday) reveals that Mother Teresa found herself in a dark night of the soul for much of her adult life. Earlier in her religious life she encountered Christ in profoundly intimate ways that filled her soul with light, consolation, and joy. It was in those earlier days that she received her call to serve the poorest of the poor on the streets of Calcutta. We have all heard of her amazing work caring for the dying and for abandoned children. We have also heard of her profound love for Jesus. So, how do we make sense of the darkness she described – and the darkness that we may experience?

As a young girl and throughout her early life as a religious sister, Jesus revealed himself to Mother Teresa as the spouse of her soul and filled her with great tenderness and consolation. But once she began her new mission to the poor in 1948, a mission that brought her international recognition and a Nobel Peace Prize, she lost her deep sense of Christ's presence within her. She experienced Christ in the "distressing disguise of the poor" around her, but no longer had the spiritual consolations of her youth.

How are we to interpret this "dark night" of M. Teresa? Was it a crisis of faith or was it a gift from God? The purpose of today's seminar will be to address this significant question. One explanation of her dark night is that she was completely in love with Jesus and wanted to identify perfectly with him. She begged to experience the chalice of Christ's sufferings, and he answered her prayer. Her sufferings enabled her to identify fully with the poorest of the poor, with those who feel unwanted, unloved, unconsolated, and so she was able to provide the very presence of Christ to untold numbers of suffering human beings. Her sufferings saved her from being corrupted by international fame and popularity. She never saw herself as important, but always as a servant of the one she loved and of the ones that He loves.

- Catholic Charities received over \$5.8 million to aid those in poverty.

- The retirement fund for clergy grew by over \$1.4 million.
- Nearly \$106,000 was granted to 17 applicants for parish outreach, pastoral ministry, and parish stewardship.
- The diocese received an additional \$760,000 to help train seminarians and support key ministries.
