

Spirituality and Religion

When conversations turn to religion, people respond with something like: “I am spiritual, but not religious.” On the surface, this seems reasonable. Claiming a religion, however, means more than simply agreeing with certain beliefs—it means fully embracing a way of life shaped by that faith. For Roman Catholics, this commitment must always be made freely; otherwise, even the sacraments lose their meaning.

Religion and spirituality, though often contrasted, are not opposed to one another. In truth, they exist in dialogue. A vibrant spiritual life draws us to religious practices, and our rituals and communal prayer flow from the spiritual experiences we encounter—moments of love, forgiveness, or healing with family, friends, or coworkers. Each Sunday we bring those experiences to the altar, celebrating them together in prayer. Through the Word of God and the Sacraments, our spirituality is given form, context, and deeper meaning.

Still, it is understandable why some hesitate to claim a religion, especially in today’s polarized climate. For many, religion is seen as rigid, divisive, or even a cause of conflict. Yet to set spirituality against religion—as if one excludes the other—is to oversimplify and, in some ways, to step back from a true search for the living God.

A *Commonweal* article described the importance of the tension between religion and spirituality. Luke Timothy Johnson observes, “The great monotheistic religions have not found it easy to reconcile the exoteric and esoteric sides.” In other words, the outward expressions of faith (ritual, structure, communal worship) and the inward dimensions (prayer, contemplation, personal encounter) must exist together. When one is emphasized over the other, imbalance results—and the challenge of holding both in harmony remains before us.

Each Sunday, we receive the gift of the gospel and the Eucharist to encounter the living God. Unlike familiar prayers such as the Our Father, centering prayer does not rely on set words or gestures. Instead, it invites us to turn inward, to seek God within the depths of our being. Such prayer is more delicate and less accessible than communal worship, yet it is no less essential. In fact, contemplative prayer has roots in the earliest Christian communities. Its hidden, interior nature does not diminish its value.

To say, “I am spiritual but not religious” is a bit like saying “I am a mechanic, but I have no tools.” As Johnson warns, “Christian mysticism that finds no center in the Eucharist or the Passion of Christ drifts into a form of self-grooming.” The tension between religion and spirituality is real—but rather than avoiding it, we are called to embrace it. In doing so, we can discover a deeper, more balanced way of following Christ.

Espiritualidad y Religión

Cuando las conversaciones giran en torno a la religión, la gente responde algo como: "Soy espiritual, pero no religioso". A primera vista, esto parece razonable. Sin embargo, profesar una religión significa más que simplemente estar de acuerdo con ciertas creencias: significa abrazar plenamente un estilo de vida moldeado por esa fe. Para los católicos romanos, este compromiso debe hacerse siempre libremente; de lo contrario, incluso los sacramentos pierden su significado.

La religión y la espiritualidad, aunque a menudo se contrastan, no se oponen. En realidad, existen en diálogo. Una vida espiritual vibrante nos lleva a las prácticas religiosas, y nuestros rituales y oración comunitaria surgen de las experiencias espirituales que vivimos: momentos de amor, perdón o sanación con familiares, amigos o compañeros de trabajo. Cada domingo llevamos esas experiencias al altar, celebrándolas juntos en oración. A través de la Palabra de Dios y los Sacramentos, nuestra espiritualidad cobra forma, contexto y un significado más profundo.

Aun así, es comprensible que algunos duden en profesar una religión, especialmente en el clima de polarización actual. Para muchos, la religión se percibe como rígida, divisiva o incluso causa de conflicto. Sin embargo, contraponer la espiritualidad a la religión — como si una excluyera a la otra — es simplificar excesivamente y, en cierto modo, alejarse de la verdadera búsqueda del Dios vivo.

Un artículo de *Commonweal* describió la importancia de la tensión entre religión y espiritualidad. Luke Timothy Johnson observa: «A las grandes religiones monoteístas no les ha resultado fácil reconciliar los aspectos exotérico y esotérico». En otras palabras, las expresiones externas de la fe (ritual, estructura, culto comunitario) y las dimensiones internas (oración, contemplación, encuentro personal) deben coexistir. Cuando se prioriza una sobre la otra, se produce un desequilibrio, y el reto de mantener ambas en armonía persiste.

Cada domingo, recibimos el don del Evangelio y la Eucaristía para encontrarnos con el Dios vivo. A diferencia de las oraciones habituales como el Padrenuestro, la oración centrante no se basa en palabras o gestos preestablecidos. En cambio, nos invita a mirar hacia nuestro interior, a buscar a Dios en lo más profundo de nuestro ser. Esta oración es más delicada y menos accesible que el culto comunitario, pero no por ello menos esencial. De hecho, la oración contemplativa tiene sus raíces en las primeras comunidades cristianas. Su naturaleza oculta e interior no disminuye su valor.

Decir: «Soy espiritual, pero no religioso» es como decir: «Soy mecánico, pero no tengo herramientas». Como advierte Johnson, «el misticismo cristiano que no encuentra su centro en la Eucaristía ni en la Pasión de Cristo deriva hacia una forma de autocuidado». La tensión entre religión y espiritualidad es real, pero en lugar de evitarla, estamos llamados a abrazarla. Al hacerlo, podemos descubrir una forma más profunda y equilibrada de seguir a Cristo.

How is God calling each of us at Saint Lucy Parish to use all that He has entrusted to us to sow seeds of faith for generations to come?

What is Christian Stewardship?

God has entrusted each of us with unique talents, gifts, and resources. He gives us more than we deserve, not for our possession, but for our participation in His mission. We are not called to be owners, but stewards—faithful caretakers who use what we’ve received to bless others and help build God’s Kingdom here and now.

Our call as Christian stewards is clear: to point others to Christ. When we embrace the command to “go and make disciples (Mt 28:19-20),” we do so in the hope that all people might come to know Jesus personally and intimately. We pray that, through the work of the Holy Spirit, hearts may be converted—learning to trust fully in God and to recognize our deep dependence on Him.

As this conversion takes root within each of us, we become *grateful receivers* of God’s gifts. And from that gratitude flows a desire to cultivate those gifts—not out of obligation, but out of love for Christ. We begin to understand that everything we have is a grace and, with that recognition, we are moved to become *generous givers*.

It is this new way of living out our lives as intentional disciples—joyously sharing with Christ and others what God has gifted to us—that is the practice of stewardship.

A Steward’s Response

Most campaigns focus solely on finances and raising money. While financial support is essential to the success of this effort, the *Sowing Seeds of Faith* campaign is about far more than just dollars—it’s about discipleship.

We affirm that everything good we possess—far beyond material wealth—is a generous gift from God. Through this campaign, we invite a deeper conversion: a shift from thinking, “All I have and all I am comes from my hard work and intelligence,” to embracing the truth that, “All I have and all I am comes from a loving God who has entrusted these blessings to me to be shared faithfully.”

This is not merely a financial decision—it is a spiritual awakening. It’s a call to live with open hands and open hearts.

Once that conversion begins to take root, the heart of a steward responds by asking: *How is God calling me to use what I have been given—more gratefully, more generously, and more faithfully—for the good of others and the glory of His Church?*



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
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
